At the September meeting Martin Payne demonstrated methods he used in undertaking off centre turning. Firstly he turned a shallow bowl where the rim was concentric with the base but the bowl was offset and then a bowl with an offset rim. His method involved removing two jaws from his chuck and having one of the remaining jaws off centre from the other as shown below. As Martin explained there are devices and jigs available from suppliers that will do the same job but there is a certain satisfaction in using available materials and a little imagination in achieving the desired end result.

In the second half of the meeting Martin showed how using more than two centres a n interesting small box can be made.
